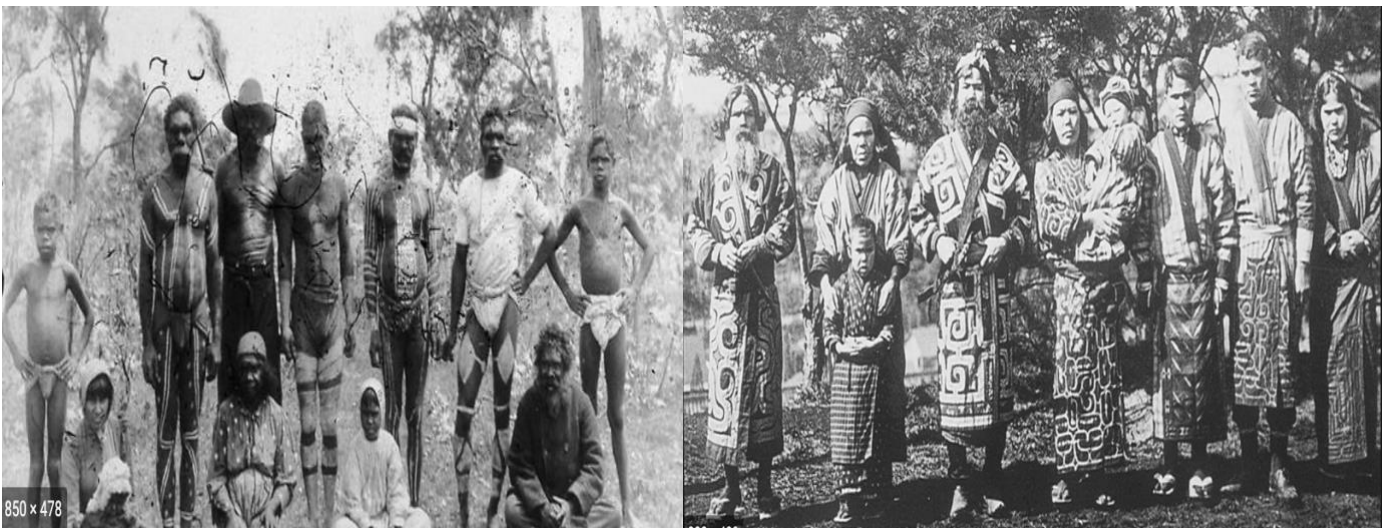


Term 3 Post Year 5 & 6 Japanese Indigenous people, the Ainu.

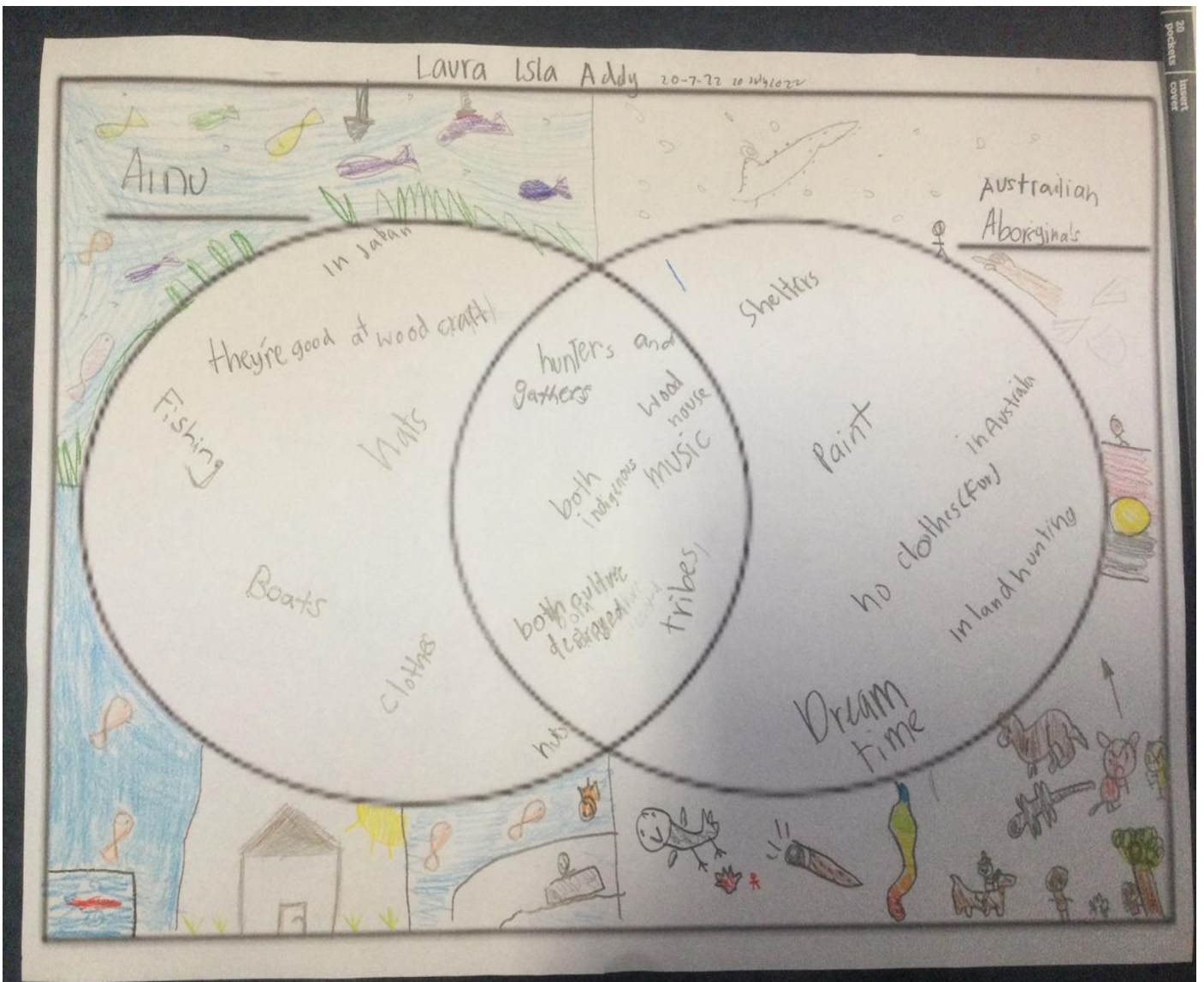
We discussed some important similarities and differences, documenting our learning on a Venn diagram.

Ainu

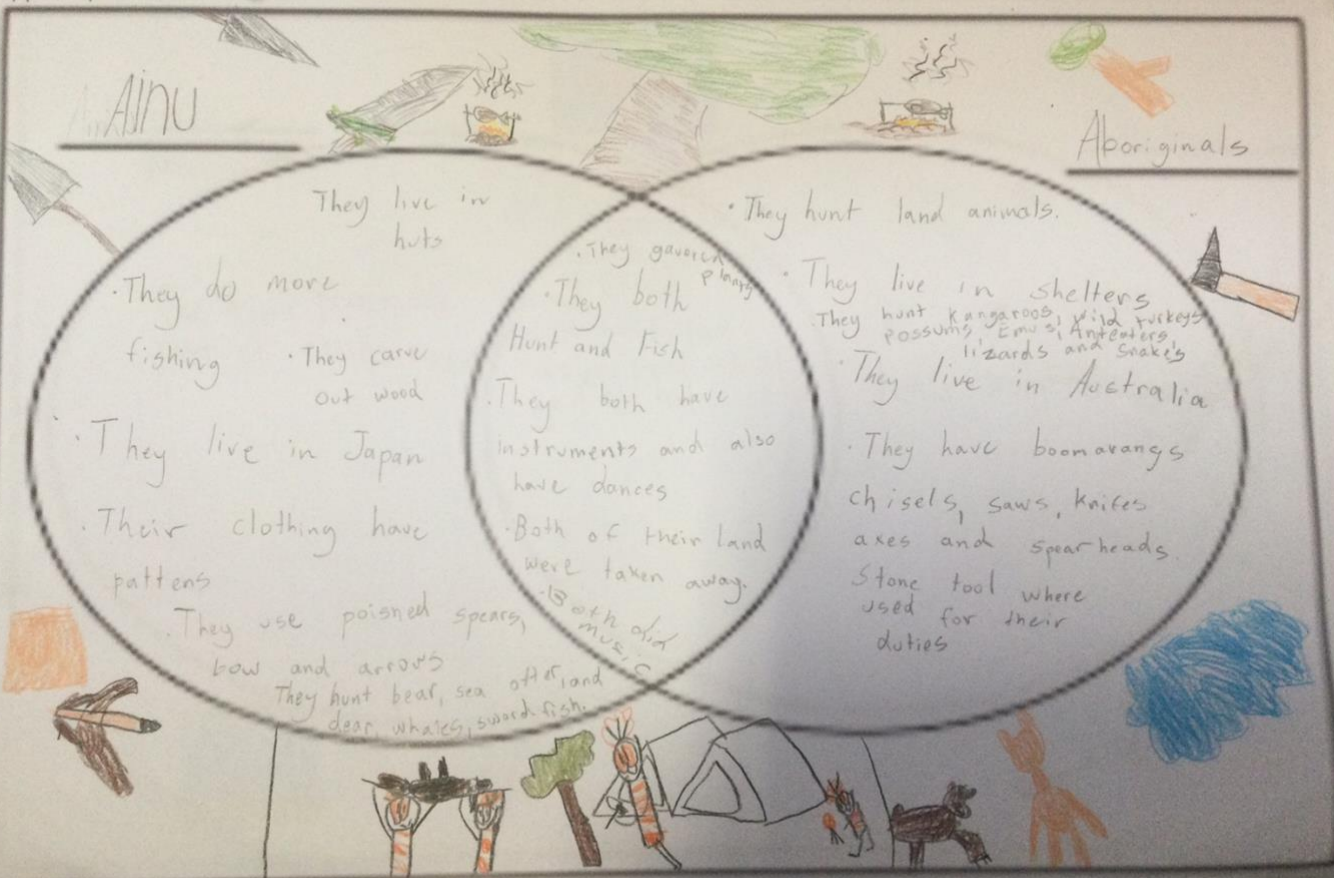
Aboriginals
